 - Now MICRO four thirds
 - Micro 4/3 no mirror box
 - Shorter distance from lens to sensor

- 2009 1st Digital full-frame mirrorless rangefinder
 - Leica M9

Types of Mirrorless Cameras

DSLR type

- Looks like a DSLR
- Has EVF & LCD panel
- Can have many controls
 - Buttons
 - Switches
 - Dials
 - Menu many items

Rangefinder type

- Compact
- May not have EVF must use LCD panel
- Not pocketable with lens
- Pancake or body cap type lens MAY BE AVAILABLE

Smaller, Lighter, Quieter, Less Expensive

- No mirror box
- No mirror
- No pentaprism
- Shorter distance from lens to sensor

Smaller & Lighter

Shorter Distance Between Lens Mount & Sensor No Mirror or Pentaprism

No Mirror to Popup

Nikon APS-C camera w/10.5mm DX lens x 1.5 crop = 15.75mm equivalent to

Nikon Full frame Camera w/16mm FX lens

• Canon APS-C w/75-300mm lens X 1.6 = 120 - 480mm

APS-C DSLR

 - 5.08"W x 3.99"H x 3.06"D
 - 17.11 oz.

Mirrorless DSLR Type

- Olympus OMD-EM1 Body Only
 - 5.1"W x 3.7"H x 2.5"D
 - -15.6

Mirrorless Range Finder Type

- Fujifilm X-E2S Body Only
 - 5.08"W x 2.95"H x 1.47"D
 - 10.6 oz.

Less Expensive

- Smaller
 - Camera body
 - Lens
- No mirror
- No pentaprism
 - Glass or plastic
- May have smaller sensor (next slide)

- Rangefinder type
 - May not have electronic viewfinder
 - May be poss. buy one
 - Cost Up to \$250
 - In hot shoe
 - Must use LCD panel

- What do you want to spend?

 - Travel
 - Is weight important?
 - Is space important?
 - What kind of lenses do you need?
 - Birding
 - Bad weather

- Read reviews
- Look at sample pictures
 - Magnify if you can
 - Load into photo editing program
- Look at camera manual if available on line
- Is raw file conversion available
 - e.g. Olympus = ORF
