- Research and plan your trip
 - Location
 - Species
 - Migration
 - Alone or with friends
 - Workshops



Before You Go... Equipment

- Binoculars
- Camera(s)
- Lenses 400mm or better
- Tripod
- Camera/lens cleaning supplies
- Waterproof cover
- Appropriate Clothing
- Water, hat, bug repellent

In the Field... (so what IS the "Field" anyway?)

- Your yard!
- Local parks, reserves, etc.
- National parks
- Wildlife management areas
- Wildlife sanctuaries
- Visitor's centers
- Fees

(Duck Stamp, Golden Eagle Pass)

In the Field...

- Care about the welfare of your subject act accordingly
- Tread gently
- Move smoothly
- Be quiet (keys out of ignition!)
- Be polite even when others are not
- Respect private property and rules

In the Field...



- Approach carefully
- Stay behind prepositioned photogs
- Never disturb birds
- No eye contact
- Be still and relaxed
- Blend in
- Study and enjoy your subject even if it means missing the shot this time
